> 85 percent of public sector covered by DB

➤ About 6,000 public retirement systems in U.S. hold \$4.5 trillion


➤ 14 million active participants and 10 million retirees and beneficiaries




Public Sector Collective Bargaining

- **➤ Not covered by National Labor Relations Act**
- > Pensions typically not a mandatory bargaining subject
- Rights established via state and local law
- **➤** No PBGC coverage
