



The Research and Collective Bargaining Services Department offers an array of services to affiliates. The most commonly requested services include:

- Financial analysis of employers.
- Analysis of health benefit plans and associated issues.
- Wage and benefit surveys.
- Contract language searches of other collective bargaining agreements.
- Analysis and training on health and safety issues.
- Background information on arbitrators.
- Anti-privatization assistance including background information on bidders, evaluation of requests for proposals and bids, comparison of public and private costs and anti-privatization policy advocacy.
- Expert testimony at an impasse arbitration, fact-finding or similar proceeding.
- Pension and retirement plan analysis and pension investment support, including support for pension trustees.
- Assistance with issues in specific occupational sectors such as health care, corrections, human services, education, libraries, transportation, public utilities, public works, law enforcement, public safety, emergency services and housing.
- AFSCME Advantage members only benefits, including AFSCME Free College.
- Public policy analysis relating to labor standards, social services, health care, taxes, workers' compensation, budget and economic development issues.
- Workshops or trainings on the above topics and others at affiliate conferences.
